

# REV CLINICS PLEDGES \$25K TO MARGARET FULLER HOUSE

*Donation will support local families and community members experiencing food and housing insecurities*

CAMBRIDGE, May 26, 2021 – [Revolutionary Clinics](#), one of the state's leading providers of medical marijuana, announced today a \$25,000 commitment to the [Margaret Fuller House](#) (MFH), a Cambridge-based organization which provides integrated services to individuals and families to empower them to overcome challenges, reach their potential and achieve their goals. The funds help provide nutritious meals to families in the Cambridge community and assist with community outreach efforts. The contributions, sent through monthly installments, have been granted since this January and represent the latest step in Rev's ongoing partnership with MFH.

"Our relationship with Revolutionary Clinics is invaluable to our mission to support members of the community in need," said Kimberly Massenburg, Executive Director of the Margaret Fuller House. "Their unwavering support – whether financially or through employee volunteering over the last three years – has helped the Margaret Fuller House continue to be a vital service provider for so many families and individuals in the Cambridge community and beyond."

Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Margaret Fuller House has worked to address the increased need for food and housing assistance, with demand for the former increased nearly 12 percent within the last year, according to Massenburg. The donation from Revolutionary Clinics will help fund the Community Advancement program, which provides case management, financial assistance, job training, healthcare resources and additional services to individuals 18 and older.

Through the creation of the Margaret Fuller Relief Fund, the financial assistance service rendered in the Community Advancement Program, the MFH has dispersed nearly \$98,000 to individuals and families in need of financial support in Cambridge and surrounding communities since March 2020. The grants have helped stop three evictions in 2020 and Revolutionary Clinics' recent contribution assists ten individuals and families with crucial monthly living expenses.

"The Margaret Fuller House is a vital asset for the City and their work has been incredibly impactful to so many in Cambridge," said Keith Cooper, CEO of Revolutionary Clinics. "Their work has taken on added importance in light of the pandemic, and they've stepped up for this community. We're honored to be their partner and help support their mission of empowering families and individuals."

Additionally, since Rev Clinics opened its dispensary in Central Square in 2019, the MFH Community Advancement team has referred over 43 individuals for employment resulting in six hires.

Revolutionary Clinics has partnered with the Margaret Fuller House since 2019 and has participated in donation drives, like the Turkey Drive and Christmas Toy Drive, provided annual contributions, and actively partakes in volunteer work at events and for special initiatives, such as distributing hand sanitizer to help support some of the most vulnerable members of the population during the peak of the pandemic. The \$25,000 donation comes on the heels of a \$5,000 contribution that Rev made to the YWCA Cambridge.

Rev has three dispensary locations, two in Cambridge and one in Somerville, and operates a wholesale arm for adult use cannabis. Revolutionary Farms, the moniker of their cultivation facility, is one of the largest and most advanced cultivation operations in the state.
